

Waste management policy of the Institute of Practical Psychophysics in accordance with WEEE Directive

The Institute of Practical Psychophysics regards as a mandate to minimize a harmful effect of its products to environment. For that purpose we introduce environmentally safe regulations and technologies of manufacturing, servicing and waste management of equipment.

Our commitments to clients

All equipments of the IPP is marked with a separate collection symbol



in accordance with EC Directive on waste electrical and electronic equipment (EEE). This symbol means that a unit was manufactured after August 13, 2005, and it cannot be collected with a common domestic waste after expiry of service life. Instead it must be delivered to a special collection facility.

EEE made by the IPP and put on the market after August 13, 2005, and purchased directly from the Institute, must be returned to the IPP by its owner at his/her own expense, where it will be waste managed in accordance with existing regulations.

Indirect sales (i.e. sales by business-partners and distributors) are divided into two categories:

- if a business-partner or a distributor is EU country resident and sells the IPP's products to a third person, who is a resident of the same country, then this business-partner or distributor is considered to be a "manufacturer" of this product and, in accordance with regulations, must accept and waste manage this product;

- if a business-partner or a distributor is EU country resident and sells the IPP's products to a third person, who is a resident of another EU country, then this business-partner or distributor, as an importer of the IPP's product into another country, is considered to be a "manufacturer" of this product and, in accordance with regulations, must accept and waste manage this product made by the IPP.

Two abovementioned categories are referred to a case when the Institute of Practical Psychophysics participates in a collective system of waste return in a corresponding EU country.

Direct sales: in accordance with legislative provisions introduced for the purpose of WEEE Directive (2012/19/EC), a client is obliged to deliver EEE waste to a recycling facility, stated by the IPP, at his/her own expense. In its turn, the IPP provides waste management of this waste in accordance with existing regulations.
